### 4. First-aid measures

## 6. Accidental release measures

### Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

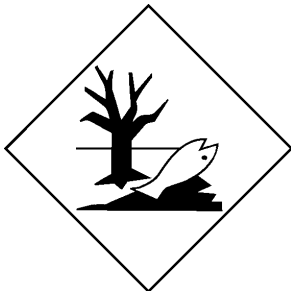
